## DUTY OFF SMALL FARM TRACTORS

For a specified period of time the duty is to be removed by the government from motor tractors under \$1,400 in value, says a recent Ottawa despatch. The decision was reached after a lengthy consideration by the cabinet council, and an official announcement is expected at an early date as to details of this added important tariff change.

This action will be taken under the War Measures Act, but it cannot be ascertained whether the duty is to be remitted or suspended for the time specified. The need for increased production is the justification for the decision arrived at.

The duty on tractors is 17½ per cent plus 7½ per cent war tariff. Just when the change becomes operative and for how long is not yet ascertainable.

## Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be, a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead patent and cultivate 10 acres extra. May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 10 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

Holders of entries may count time of employment as farm labourers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at local agent's Office (but not Sub-agency). Discharge papers must be presented to agent.




